Graduate School of Nursing Curriculum Policy

Thesis Course:

- 1. Common subjects include those related to trends in healthcare and welfare, statistics, theory, research, and ethics, which form the foundation of specialized subjects.
- Specialized subjects include basic functional nursing, which develops foundational knowledge of nursing, and practical nursing, which focuses on the application of nursing practices based on scientific evidence, lectures and seminars to explore research issues.

3. Research subjects are divided into two stages, starting with the selection of a research theme and culminating in the completion of a thesis and presentation of research results. Subjects are arranged according to the stage.

Certified Nurse Specialist Course:

- 1. Common subjects include those related to trends in healthcare and welfare, statistics, theory, research, and ethics, which form the foundation of specialized subjects, as well as subjects that form the basis for carrying out advanced nursing practice.
- 2. Specialized subjects include basic functional nursing and practical nursing, incorporating the latest knowledge in each specialized field. Lectures, exercises, and practical subjects are included to develop the skills necessary to perform the role of a specialized nurse through practice.
- 3. Research subjects focus on exploring ways to improve the quality of care in the specialized field, with a focus on issues rooted in nursing practice.

Graduate School of Nursing Admissions Policy

- 2. Individuals who possess a self-motivated attitude towards learning and can adapt to various learning environments.
